

Section IV. First Aid Measures		Sergene	Page 2 of 4
Eye Contact	Flush eyes with water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention.		
Skin Contact	Remove contaminated clothing and wash contaminated skin with large amounts of water. If irritation persists, contact a physician.		
Inhalation	Remove patient from contaminated area. If breathing has stopped, give artificial respiration. Contact a physician immediately.		
Ingestion	Induce vomiting of conscious patient immediately. Contact a physician immediately.		
Note to Physician	Mild intoxication occurs at blood levels of 0.05% - 0.15%. Severe poisoning occurs when the blood Ethanol level is 0.3% - 0.5%. Above 0.5%, the patient will be comatose and death can occur.

The Product Is	Flammable
Auto-Ignition Temperature	793°F (422°C)
Fire Degradation Products	Carbon Monoxide, Ammonia, Organic Acids and Aldehydes
Flash Point	57°F (14°C) TCC
Flammable Limits	3.3 - 19.0% by Volume
Fire Extinguishing Procedures	Use CO <sub>2</sub> or dry chemicals for small fires, alcohol type or all purpose type foams for large fires. Use water spray to cool fire exposed containers and structures. Wear self-contained breathing apparatus and complete personal protective equipment when potential for exposure to vapors or products of combustion exist.
Flammability	Flammable liquid; may release vapors that form flammable mixtures when temperatures are at or above the flash point. Vapor is heavier than air and can travel considerable distances to a source of ignition and flashback.

VI. Accidental Release Measures	
Spill and Leak	Eliminate ignition sources. Wear suitable protective equipment. Small spills may be flushed with large quantities of water. Larger spills should be collected for disposal.
Protective Clothing in Case of Large Spill	Respirator: Supplied air respirator (self-contained or air-line) in high vapor concentrations. Eye Protection: Chemical Safety Glasses Gloves: Rubber or vinyl gloves  A safety shower and eyewash should be available.
Waste Disposal	All disposal should be in accordance with federal, state and local regulations.
